Alberta perspectives on the pandemic, between May 25 and June 29, 2020

Some context...

At the time of this survey, Alberta was in the first stages of re-opening after a prolonged lock-down.

- Schools closed
- Cases of COVID-19 reported across Alberta, with majority in the Calgary Zone
- Many public facilities such as recreation centres closed
- Many working remotely



Most Albertans **felt protected from COVID-19 infection**, but survey data revealed mixed reactions to the public health restrictions.



Many Albertans **reported impacts to their health and wellness** because of the pandemic.



11,000+

Albertans provided feedback.

Survey results were weighted to represent Albertans on age, gender and Alberta Health Services Zone.



Virtual healthcare was mostly positive for Albertans. Many were open to continuing to receive virtual care in the future.




Albertans frequently sought information about the pandemic, and relied heavily on Dr. Deena Hinshaw as their most trusted source of COVID-19 information.

Opinions on public health actions










Change in **cannabis use** by Albertans since March 2020




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Did Albertans find the care advice they received during their recent virtual healthcare visit helpful?






Did Albertans think **virtual healthcare visits could be a good alternative** to in-person visits in the future?









Understanding the perspectives



HQCA COVID-19 Survey – May 25 to June 29, 2020

There are differences among some of the Alberta Health Services Zones on specific questions. Here are a few examples...

NORTH ZONE

- **21%** felt very well protected from being infected by COVID-19.
- **6%** say delaying seeking help for a medical problem because of COVID-19 greatly affected their health.
- **77%** had a virtual healthcare visit recently.

CENTRAL ZONE

- **31%** felt very well protected from being infected by COVID-19.
- **28%** say delaying seeking help for a medical problem because of COVID-19 greatly affected their health.
- **86%** had a virtual healthcare visit recently.

CALGARY ZONE

- **20%** felt very well protected from being infected by COVID-19.
- **7%** say delaying seeking help for a medical problem because of COVID-19 greatly affected their health.
- **90%** had a virtual healthcare visit recently.

EDMONTON ZONE

- **18%** felt very well protected from being infected by COVID-19.
- **6%** say delaying seeking help for a medical problem because of COVID-19 greatly affected their health.
- **87%** had a virtual healthcare visit recently.

SOUTH ZONE

- **24%** felt very well protected from being infected by
- **3%** say delaying seeking help for a medical problem because of COVID-19 greatly affected their health.
- **88%** had a virtual healthcare visit recently.

Albertans were more likely to say restrictions went too far if they are...

- Men, aged 35-44
- Over 35, and check for news about COVID-19 less frequently than others
- Under 35, and report their mental and physical health to be worse during the pandemic
- Over 55, and live in a rural area
- Not living with a chronic condition that may put them at additional risk

Albertans were more likely to say restrictions are being lifted too quickly if they are...

- Women
- Not feeling well-protected from COVID-19
- Not negatively affected by restrictions at health facilities
- Well-connected virtually to friends and family
- Check the news about COVID-19 frequently, especially if they are over 35

How are we doing today, Alberta?





Since we first surveyed Albertans on COVID-19 in May and June, more of the economy has relaunched and key public health decisions have been made this summer including:

- 1) Changes to continuing care visitation
- 2) School re-opening plans
- 3) Mask mandates in some Alberta municipalities

That's why we're measuring Albertans' experiences during COVID-19 again this fall.
