The HQCA gathers and analyzes information and collaborates with Alberta Health Services, Alberta Health, academia, health professions and other stakeholders to translate that knowledge into practical improvements to health service quality and patient safety in the healthcare system. The HQCA is an independent corporation legislated under the Health Quality Council of Alberta Act.
